Learning Gains through Play update

Teachers and Senior Management Teams from the five project schools in the Western Cape attended a weekend of workshops in February 2015. The workshops were held at the MEED Offices in Kuilsriver and were attended by forty three participants and facilitated by Tracey Butchart with the support of Sipho Didiza and Rodney Nissan. With only two hours available on the Friday after school, the Saturday was a long but fruitful day. ICT4RED Teacher Professional Development: Gallery Walk and Field Trip (Module 8&9)

The ICT4RED project is a ground-breaking project which contributes to the improvement of rural education through technology-led innovation. Teachers in this project need to 'earn' their tablets by attending all trainings (10 Modules) and to submit set homework in the Teacher Professional Development (TPD). Gallery Walk teaching strategy involved creating a Gallery Walk session in a classroom, using social media platforms to participate in online discussions as an example. Another activity that was important in this module is how a professional learning community works and how it can be a teaching strategy applicable in a classroom. Teachers highlighted that some of the exhibits like phishing and digital identities were things not to be overlooked as a lot of people have been victims of such things.

The eighth and ninth module were conducted in Queenstown at Get Ahead College on 21 February 2015. The training was also attended by visitors from Rhodes University (lectures and students) CSIR Ethnographic Researcher, student from London researching about the project, Cofimvaba district officials and not forgetting a news reporter for Queenstown local newspaper Daily Rep.



Intel Easy Steps - Thiabane women against abuse group trained

Thlabane is a community where women have formed a group against abuse. This group aims to empower women in the community so that they are aware of what abuse is and thus can arm themselves with knowledge of how to find ways to get out of the situation they find themselves in. Intel along with the Department of Communication, Deloitte Foundation, and Telkom are working together to provide this community with training and support so that the women have more skills to uplift themselves. Intel agreed to sponsor two training workshops for groups of women from the area to benefit from Digital literacy.



The facilitator, Mr Thabo Nkwe, reflects the following:

"This was the first kind of group I ever came across in my 18 years training experience. Given these women's personal experience in relation to abuse and the grievousness and magnitude of cases of abuse against women and children they are exposed to; I take my hat off to them! No wonder I could sense a forceful demand from within to heed to their outcry which they could not express with words but through their performance during training. Today I can rightfully say women are stronger than men in many respects."

Commonwealth Certificate for Teacher ICT Integration (CCTI) Orientation workshops in Uganda

Senzo Ngcobo and Gerald Roos went off to Kampala again this month to conduct workshops for the second phase in support the Commonwealth Certificate for Teacher ICT Integration (CCTI). The Ministry of Education and Sports in Uganda had invited 68 participants to take part at the Uganda Technology and Management University (UTAMU) in Kampala, Uganda, from February 16-19, 2015.



Intel Easy Steps- University of Limpopo Training

The University of Limpopo is situated in the Mankweng area in the Limpopo province. The University of Limpopo is working through their e-skills programme and sought Intel's expertise to enhance the current offering to their various beneficiaries. Intel in collaboration with the University agreed to sponsor a Training of Trainers workshop so that Trainers and Lecturers at the University would be fully conversant with the Intel Easy steps offering and how this could be adapted for use by the University.

Eight participants attended the training and this included the Director, Mr Farivar Rahimi, and technical "expert" Mr Andrew Scholtz. The three-day programme included an understanding of the coursework, facilitation of modules and brainstorming ways to include the programme into the University's current offering.



SchoolNet provides professional development for Matthew Goniwe School of Leadership Schools of the Future

The Gauteng Department of Education seeks to create an enabled environment by providing ICT infrastructure to schools. Over the past six months, SchoolNet SA worked with the Matthew Goniwe School of Leadership to provide training in using and managing ICT resources to teachers to staff from six schools involved in the School of the Future Pilot Project. School leaders from these schools completed the *Management and Usage of ICTs in Public Schools* course which included developing a vision for ICT usage, creating ICT plans and managing ICT resources. Teachers then completed the *Intel Getting Started* course which included activities focused on basic computer skills and 21st Century teaching. Finally teachers were introduced to the *Microsoft Teaching with Technology* course – a free, online course that aims to develop a deeper understanding of how ICT integration can enhance the teaching and learning experience.
