

SA maths teacher wins top innovation prize

A South African teacher has been awarded top honours for innovation by the United Nations and Microsoft. Kumares Pillay, a maths teacher at Burnwood Secondary School in Durban, won the Innovative Teacher Forum awards in the Finnish capital, Helsinki.

Pillay created a matric maths and physics website - www.mlearner.co.za - that pupils can access cheaply on their cellphones. Burnwood Principal, Vinesh Gokul, says MLearner was pitted against the creations of 500 teachers from 50 countries.
