

Kathryn Riva – A Microsoft Innovative Educator Expert Using Sway



Sway for learners

During the Grade 5 Blended Learning Week at Micklefield the girls were given the task of exploring countries and cities in Africa. This task was carried out using research skills and the girls presented their findings as a Microsoft Sway. For each section, namely finding facts, adding relevant videos, including appropriate pictures and creating a link to an article to back-up ones findings, the girls were required to follow different instructions. "The girls loved the task and have been requesting to use Sway again. After trying out Sway for the first time some of the girls went ahead and made their own Sways about their pets at home over the weekend.

In addition to the activity using Sway, Kathryn has developed and shared a further thirteen learning activities. Kathryn says, "My learning activities are all projects or ideas that I altered or created to become Blended Learning Projects, to promote deeper learning in our girls. These projects were across all my subject areas and included English, Mathematics, Natural Sciences and Technology, Social Sciences and Life Skills."

Support for colleagues

Kathryn says that her Principal and the Head of Computers at Micklefield School both encouraged her to enter the Microsoft Innovative Teacher competition as she had been using and experimenting with Microsoft tools and Web 2.0 tools in her classroom for the past few years. Kathryn says that she has been personally using Microsoft products for eighteen years and she has kept up to date exploring all the updated features.

At Micklefield School, Kathryn_runs a staff computer upskilling program. She helps the teachers to develop their computer skills for their personal growth or to create lessons using technology in their classrooms.

She says, "I had to do a presentation for the staff last week and I presented my information using Sway. I also shared the Sway with the staff as well as the URL to try it out. It has now become one of the topics on my staff computer upskilling program. The computer teacher was very eager to give it go too and created her own Sway."

Global Forum Inspiration

Global Forums are a great way to be introduced to new products and to see how other teachers are using them in their classrooms. Kathryn says that in addition to being introduced to Sway at the Forum, she started taking notes at the Dubai Global Forum using OneNote and she can't wait to start using Office Mix.

"The Dubai Global Forum inspired me to keep on learning" says Kathryn, and whilst not every teacher will have an opportunity to attend a Global Forum, any teacher can access the tools, courses and learning activities that use them on the Microsoft Educator Community.
